Detailed Itinerary

Tour Itinerary: Auckland(3N)-Paihia(2N)-Rotorua(2N)-Te Anau(2N)-Mt Cook Village(1N)-Queenstown(2N)-Christchurch(2N)

Day 1: Arrival at Auckland

Upon arrival at Auckland International Airport, you shall be picked up in your rental vehicle and proceed to your hotel. Get an earlier flight so as to reach Auckland by morning. That leaves you with enough time to explore and drive through the city. New Zealand's self-proclaimed 'City of Sails' is the country's largest metro area. Resting between the Pacific Ocean and the Tasman Sea, this urban paradise has something for everyone. Surrounded by native bush, rainforests and an abundance of beaches, Auckland is a playground for both the city savvy and those with an eye for adventure. Explore the central museums and galleries on foot, or take a drive through to see deserted beaches, waterfalls and native forest. Overnight in Auckland.

Day 2: Auckland City Tour

Today after breakfast; it's time to explore the City of Auckland. New Zealand's biggest city offers a huge variety of sightseeing tours and activities thanks to its spectacular location - Auckland straddles an isthmus between two harbours, with 48 volcanic cones scattered across its skyline. A beautiful scenic drive through Tamaki Drive Coastal Road takes you to Bastion Point for a scenic view of Auckland Harbour. We then proceed to the extinct volcanic crater Mt. Eden for a different view of Auckland. Spend a relaxing time at Auckland Domain by the foothills of One Tree Hill. You're spoilt for choice when it comes to views of the city too - the Auckland Sky Tower offers a 360 degree panorama from its Sky Deck, 220 metres above the CBD. Overnight in Auckland.

Day 3: Auckland to Paihia

After breakfast, you will head towards Paihia. Paihia is a bustling seaside town right in the heart of the Bay of Islands. It has superb golden sand beaches that are safe for swimming and sunbathing, scenic walks to explore, and a wide range of recreational activities. In the evening enjoy free time to peruse the small shops and boutiques of this quaint seaside village. Overnight in Paihia.

Day 4: Paihia (Hole in the Rock Dolphin Cruise)

After breakfast, board a deluxe catamaran and glide out towards the open ocean, past some 144 islands that make up the Bay of Islands. Glimpse at secluded islands and pristine beaches and keep watch for dolphins and whales, as you head towards the remote Cape Brett Peninsula. See the famous lighthouse perched on the headland and the famed Hole in the Rock at Motukokako Island. Marvel as your skipper expertly guides your boat through the tight space (weather and ocean conditions permitting) before heading back into the sheltered waters of the bay. You can also take a ferry to the charming township of Russell (own cost). Russell holds an important place in New Zealand's history, being the country's first sea port. New Zealand's first licensed hotel, bar and restaurant, The Duke of Marlborough is located on the waterfront in the historic village of Russell. A stroll around the streets will lead you to the Catholic Mission 'Pompallier', which is New Zealand's oldest surviving Roman Catholic building. Another building to admire is Christ Church, the oldest existing church in New Zealand, which still carries musket ball holes from the New Zealand Land Wars. Take the
