Detailed Itinerary

Tour Itinerary: (N)-Shillong(1N)-Cherrapunjee(3N)-Shillong(2N)-Guwahati(1N)

Day 1: Arrival At Guwahati and transfer to shillong

Upon arrival at Guwahati Airport (arrive by 12pm), you shall be picked up in your exclusive vehicle and transferred to Shillong. Enroute visit the largest manmade lake of Northeast India - Umiam Lake. Mesmerizing Waterfalls, crystal clear Lakes and impressive Mountains make up the city of Shillong. It is the capital of Meghalaya and an ideal place to unwind amidst natural beauty and serenity. Upon arrival, you are at leisure to explore the beautiful town of Shillong.

Day 2: Mawryngkhang - The Scariest Trek of Meghalaya

After breakfast, head towards Wahkhen, a small hamlet in the interiors of East Khasi Hills. Enroute, visit the Shillong Peak; the highest point in state of Meghalaya. Shillong Peak is a view-point where you can get breathtaking view of Shillong City. Visit the famous Elephant Falls - it is a two-tier waterfall set in the dingles of the rocks. Next on the list is the main attraction of the day; the spectacular 'Mawryngkhang Trek'; considered to be one of the scariest treks of Meghalaya. The Mawryngkhang Trek starts from Wahkhen Village. To reach Mawryngkhang from Wahkhen, you have to walk down the mountain. Eventually, you will reach a rickety bamboo bridge that gradually takes you over a series of natural pools and past the ridge of the mountain with deep valley down below. The bridge is the result of hard work on the part of the locals and is perched on the side of huge solid rock. After walking right at the ridge of the mountain you will reach Mawryngkhang from where you can see deep valleys and high green mountains at a farther distance. It is a sight to behold and every step will seem worth the effort. Later, proceed to Cherrapunji for overnight stay.

Day 3: A Waterfall Tour

After breakfast, proceed towards Nohkalikai Falls; the tallest plunge waterfall in India. With a drop of about 335 m the Nohkalikai Falls is the fourth highest waterfall in the whole world. The mesmerizing beauty of the falls is aptly complemented by the stunning forests and verdant valleys all around. Situated in the lap of the rugged mountainous terrain, this waterfall is a gem hidden away from the clutches of the metropolitan life. Further, head to Dain-Thlen Waterfall; one of the most picturesque waterfalls in the region, and thus, an important hub for tourists in Cherrapunji. Visit 'The Seven Sister Falls' view point. The Seven Sister Falls is a kind of waterfall which symbolizes the seven states in Northeast India. This Waterfall is famed for its enormous size as the streams drop from limestone cliffs from a height of almost 1035 feet, and the waterfall has an average width of 70 metres. The most beautiful vistas of the waterfall can be witnessed during sunset and sunrise hours when vibrant colours illuminate the water streams. Monsoon marks the maximum footfall when the force of the water is at its peak and the falls are engulfed in clouds and mist. Later in the evening, visit Kynrem Falls. Kynrem Falls is a three-tiered waterfall, making for a scenic sight worth admiring. The crystal clear water stream plummets down from a height of nearly a thousand feet, leaving the spectators awestruck. The soft noise of the rumbling noise and dense mist adorning the water are bound to rejuvenate your soul. If time permits, head towards 'Mawsynram', regarded as the wettest place on Planet Earth. Mawsynram receives close to a whopping 12m of rain every year.
